INDEPENDENT DOCUFILM SERIES

Docked

Docked examines the plight of sheepherders working the Western Range of the Rocky Mountains through the eyes of Tom Acker (a human rights activist), Ignacio Alvarado (a former sheepherder from Chile) and Lionel (a current sheepherder from Chile) as he works his sheep through the ranges in Colorado and Wyoming. Brought into the country through the Department of Labor's (DOL) H2A temporary visa program because no American is willing to work under these conditions, they are paid \$750 a month for a job that requires being on call 24/7. With the rational that these sheepherders are being brought in from third world countries where they would have earned less money and lived in similar conditions, the film explores whether that argument for denying sheepherders basic human rights.







Community Shares of Colorado & DOLA Grant

UUCGV Awarded \$50,000!

Community Shares of Colorado along with the Department Of Local Affairs (DOLA), are working together to administer infrastructure grants to small community-based organizations that have a track record of providing effective, culturally responsive, and relevant programs and services to communities who have historically been underrepresented, underserved or under-resourced in Colorado.

These funds are to be used for one or more of the following eligible projects only: Data technology needs including data collection and technology infrastructure; professional development for staff and board members; strategic planning and organizational development for capacity building, fundraising, and other services; communications; and existing program expansion, development, or evaluation. Funds are not eligible to be used on the following expenses: capital improvement projects, real estate or land acquisition, payment of debt, advocacy or lobbying, organizing, and endowments or reserves.
