BOOK REVIEW - ANNGELINE BARRETT

RESTORING THE SOUL OF THE WORLD - OUR LIVING BOND WITH NATURE'S INTELLIGENCE BY DAVID FIDELER

I recently read a wonderful book that I wanted to share with the congregation. It fits well with our Green Team mission and our seventh UU Covenant. In addition, it was an enjoyable read. It is the first book I've read in a long time that I actually looked at the footnotes for every page because the sources of information were so interesting.

The author, David Fideler, "studied ancient religions and philosophy at the University of Pennsylvania and holds a Ph.D. in philosophy and the history of science and cosmology".

To describe the book in a nut shell: it is a broad brush history of philosophical and religious thought of the Western world since pre-historic times. I know that sounds like an impossible task, but he looks at it through the eye of humanity's vision of the Spiritual Essence of Nature. As Einstein is often quoted, "Look deep into Nature and then you will understand everything better". This is something I am passionate about.

"In the beginning, philosophy and science were the same – and both were connected to religion, because the desire to understand the cosmos has always been a spiritual quest". Fideler gives us hope that with this ancient and modern way of looking at the world, we will be able to return to Nature as a way to solve the problems we have gotten ourselves into.

PLEDGE STATEMENTS AND CALENDAR YEAR TAX INFORMATION

Pledge Statements and Calendar Year Tax Information will be in the mail soon. We use the Quickbooks program to generate the statements. "Amount Due" is what the program calls the balance at the bottom of the page. Pledge payments are voluntary. You can be a member by donating time or talent even if you don't have money to donate. Thank you to everyone who contributes to UUCGV.

NPI GRANT APPLICATION

In the September 2023 Newsletter I mentioned we had applied for \$70,800 from Colorado DOLA through their Nonprofit Infrastructure (NPI) Grants. I am happy to report that on January 17, 2024 we were notified that we would receive \$50,000 over the next three years, contingent on providing proof of required insurance and choosing which projects to fund. We are working on the insurance coverage. The Finance Team will be discussing the projects on February 5. If you have input, feel free to attend the meeting, contact anyone on the Finance Team, or contact anyone on the Board.

INCOME AND EXPENSES

As of the end of December, pledge payments were at 55% of budget and offerings got a big boost from a \$5000 donation from the McCary Family Fund. We are showing a surplus overall.

The Haunted Auction paddle funds are earmarked for buying a customer relationship management (CRM) software program from Salesforce. Salesforce wants to see proof of our nonprofit status by going to the IRS website before allowing us to get the huge cost savings as a nonprofit. As a church, we are not required to file any forms with the IRS to prove our status, but because Salesforce and some other entities are requesting to see us on the IRS website, we are working with the IRS to make that happen.

In December, the congregation contributed \$2,275 for staff bonuses. This combined with the 1% of base salary and \$400 for employer payroll taxes (FICA, unemployment, etc) that were in the budget to create total pre-individual-tax bonuses of \$3,545. This was split among six staff: the Minister, Program Director, Administrator, Facilities Manager, Music Director, and Childcare provider. Thank you to the congregation for your generosity and to our Staff for being so awesome.



We are considering purchasing a few more copies of our hymnals. Before we invest in new ones, do you have any at home that you no

longer use?

If so, please return them so we can have more available on Sundays. If you still attend service virtually, please keep them if you'd like. We also have copies of each week's hymns on the website along with the Order of Service.
