FROM OUR MINISTER, REVEREND WENDY JONES

What does it mean to transform? Does transformation happen immediately, or does it take place slowly overtime? Is a fast transformation the way to go, or is slow, steady and gradual a better approach?

As I spend some time reflecting on theme of transformation this month, I can't help but pay attention to nature and the divine rhythms that are found within it. Nature is in a constant state of movement and rhythmic transformation, and it can be extremely slow and gentle, as with water slowly carving out beautiful canyons or swift with the occasional tornado, hurricane or tidal wave.

How often do we let ourselves be in divine rhythm in our own lives with the flow of the seasons, slowing down in the winter, slowly emerging in the spring, becoming playful in the summer and centering down in the fall?

How do we transform overtime as we move through our own rhythms and cycles of life? Is our own transformation a slow gradual unfolding? Or is it sudden and abrupt? Is one way to make change better than the other?

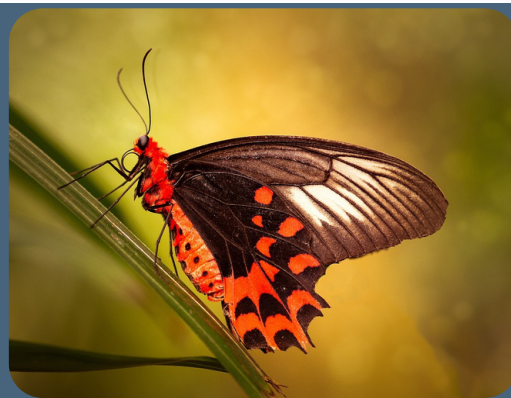

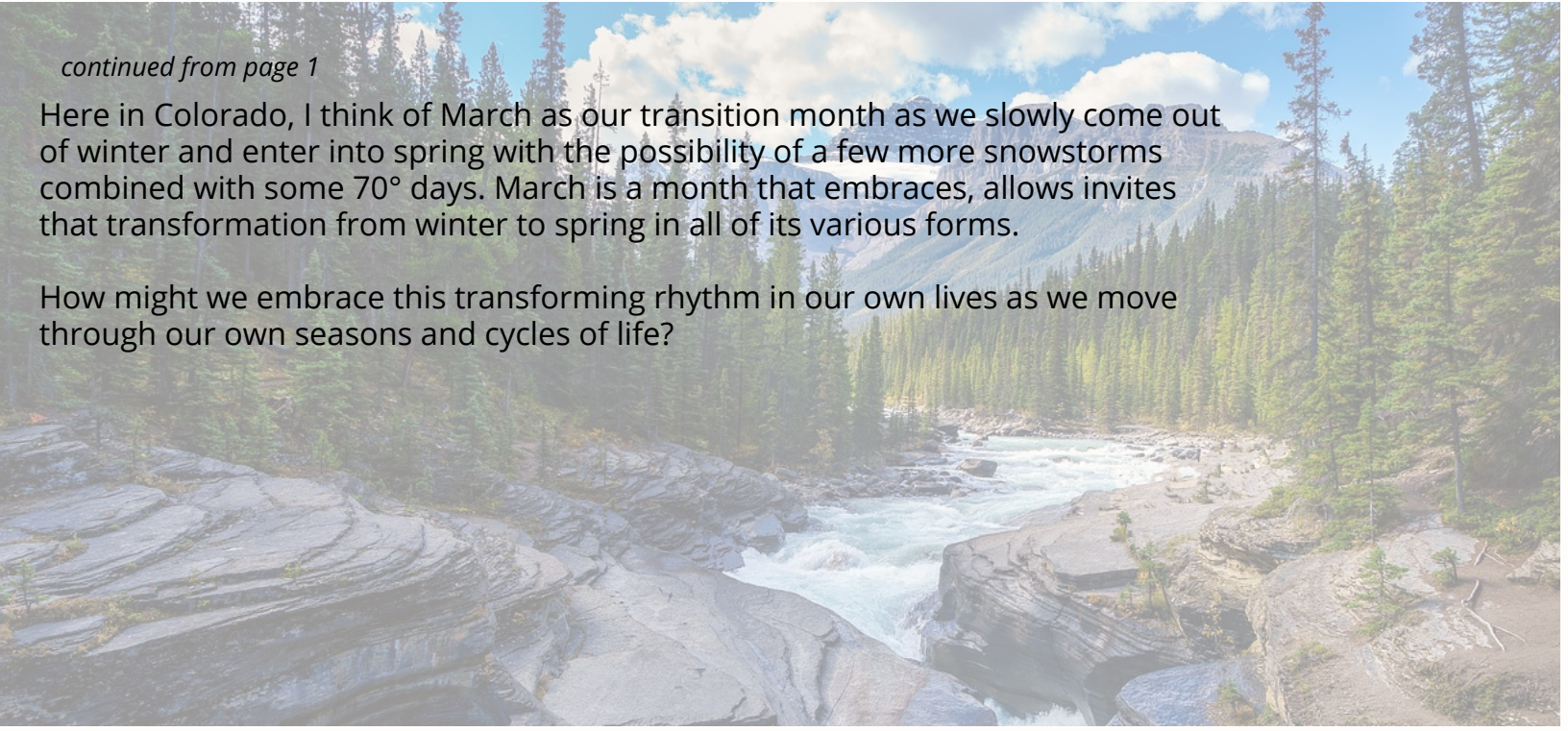

How might we embrace this transforming rhythm in our own lives as we move through our own seasons and cycles of life?

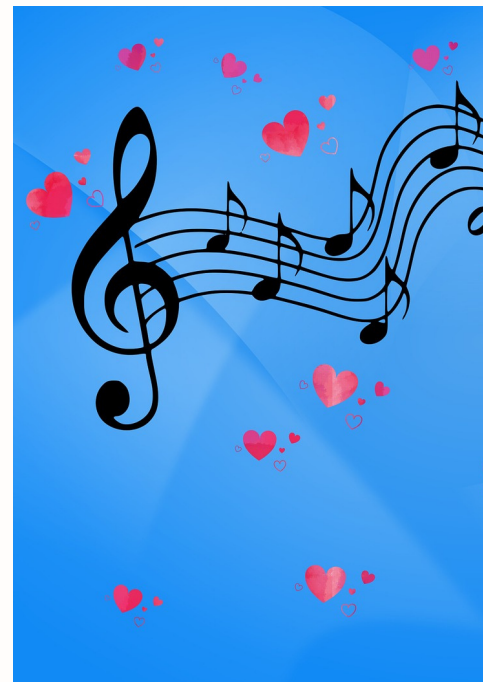


UUCGV MUSIC BRINGING JOY AND VIBRANCY TO OUR CONGREGATION!

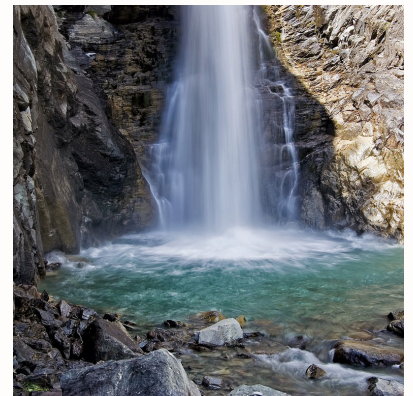
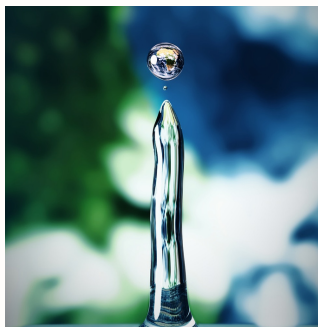

March 5

Transformation ~ Change happens

Transformation, our theme of the month, means change. Compost transforms natural materials like leaves, grass and kitchen scraps into soil and humus that is a rich gift to plants. Just like compost, transformation is sometimes hard and messy. It's a cycle of changes that includes difficult or messy times along with beauty and excitement. Change and transformation is hard, but we can do hard things. So, for today's session, we are going to explore ways that transformation is both difficult and beautiful.

BUILDING YOUR OWN THEOLOGY - WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOU DIE?

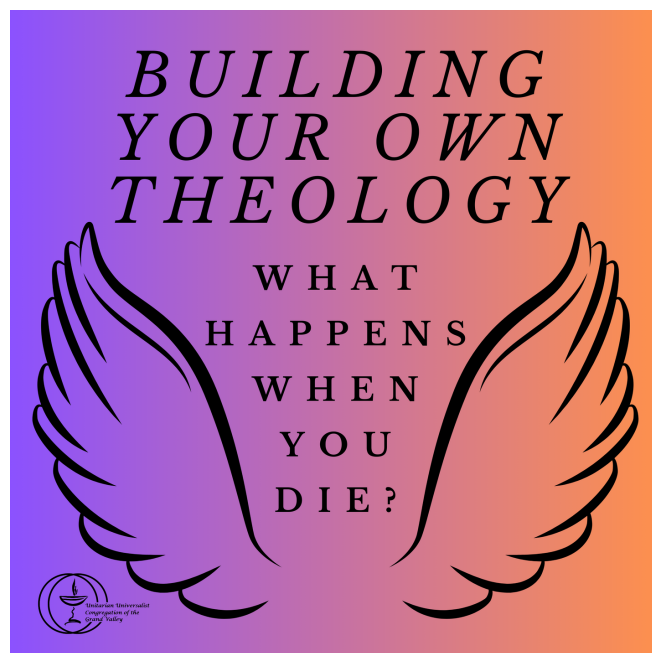

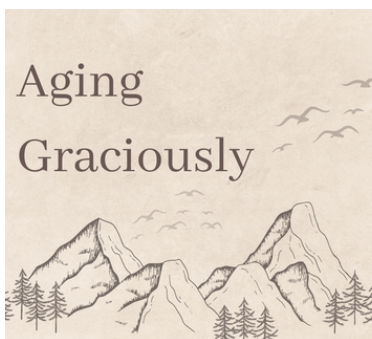

NPI GRANT APPLICATION

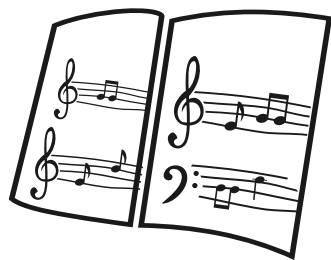
In the September 2023 Newsletter I mentioned we had applied for \$70,800 from Colorado DOLA through their Nonprofit Infrastructure (NPI) Grants. I am happy to report that on January 17, 2024 we were notified that we would receive \$50,000 over the next three years, contingent on providing proof of required insurance and choosing which projects to fund. We are working on the insurance coverage. The Finance Team will be discussing the projects on February 5. If you have input, feel free to attend the meeting, contact anyone on the Finance Team, or contact anyone on the Board.

INCOME AND EXPENSES

As of the end of December, pledge payments were at 55% of budget and offerings got a big boost from a \$5000 donation from the McCary Family Fund. We are showing a surplus overall.

The Haunted Auction paddle funds are earmarked for buying a customer relationship management (CRM) software program from Salesforce. Salesforce wants to see proof of our nonprofit status by going to the IRS website before allowing us to get the huge cost savings as a nonprofit. As a church, we are not required to file any forms with the IRS to prove our status, but because Salesforce and some other entities are requesting to see us on the IRS website, we are working with the IRS to make that happen.

In December, the congregation contributed \$2,275 for staff bonuses. This combined with the 1% of base salary and \$400 for employer payroll taxes (FICA, unemployment, etc) that were in the budget to create total pre-individual-tax bonuses of \$3,545. This was split among six staff: the Minister, Program Director, Administrator, Facilities Manager, Music Director, and Childcare provider. Thank you to the congregation for your generosity and to our Staff for being so awesome.

- UUCGV awarded NPI grant for \$50,000 to be used over the next 3 years
- WE Shelter was a success. Hosted 12 men for 2 weeks
- Code of Conduct reviewed. Almost complete and will be ready soon for posting
- Agreed to support brother Moji Agha and his Peace and Truth Heals (PATH) initiative and 2024 US speaking tour as a spiritual/organizational ally. He will be giving a talk/workshop at UUCGV
- Reviewed UUCGV's involvement in Palestine fundraiser

Team Leadership Circle, TLC, maintains the Programs of the church and the church calendar which live into the Mission, Vision, and Principles of UUCGV.

TLC communicates with the board about the day-to-day operations of the church and provides support to the teams if they need it.
