
Building Your Own Theology: A Deep Dive into the Enneagram







Cloud Appreciation Society Founder and author Gavin Pretor-Pinney will be presenting in Grand Junction on Saturday, October 7th at 6:30p.m. in the Dominguez Hall at Colorado Mesa University. His talk entitled, "Cloud Spotting as a Science and a Philosophy" is an illustrated tour of our skies featuring a collection of stunning photography of our aerial architecture. An enlightening and entertaining speaker, Pretor-Pinney will address how to recognize the many varied and dramatic cloud formations and how cloud identification can help forecast the weather and more. Adults and children are welcome. Tickets available soon!

The October 7th event marks Pretor-Pinney's first visit to the Grand Junction area. A TED Global speaker with 1.3 million views, Pretor-Pinney is the founder of the Cloud Appreciation Society. Headquartered in England, the organization has cloud spotters from 120 countries. He is the author of "Cloud Collector's Handbook" (2009) and "A Cloud A Day" published by Chronicle Books (2021). Pretor-Pinney will explain why clouds look the way they do, how the sky has played a cameo role throughout the history of art and how clouds reveal the invisible movements of our atmosphere. The presentation is replete with images from members sent from around the world.

"When the sky puts on a show, you just have to be prepared to pause what you are doing and engage with it for a few moments," says Pretor-Pinney. A reception is planned following the talk.

In addition, Pretor-Pinney will host a cloud spotting workshop for children (including hands-on activities) on Friday, October 6th at 6:00p.m. at the Unitarian Universalist Congregation of the Grand Valley (UUCGV) at 536 Ouray Avenue. Admission to the children's workshop is free. Registration is required.

Household Energy: Heating & Cooling with Heat Pumps

Shortly after selling our 4-bedroom house in Houston and moving into our 2-bedroom house in GJ in 2013, Jan and I set about the task of trying to live more simply. Part of this goal was financial; part was ecological. In 2014 we invested in solar panels that enabled us to reduce our electricity cost by nearly 70 percent.

When our AC unit died in 2021, we had the option of replacing it with another AC unit or trying something new: an air-source Heat Pump. As always there were "pros" and "cons" in this decision. Here's a quick recap of what we faced:

Heat Pump Pros	Heat Pump Cons		
More efficient than AC units; absorb and move ambient heat for heating and cooling (from inside to outside or outside to inside) rather than burning fuel	More expensive to purchase than an AC unit. In our quotes 30% more. But lifetime operating cost significantly lower than AC units		
Would eliminate need for a Furnace, thus reducing heating-related carbon emissions by 40%	Would require an Air Handler unit to circulate air		
Environmentally-friendly; amplifies benefits of solar panel- generated electricity	Heating capability limited in cold climates (temperatures below 0 degrees F)		
Eligible for substantial federal, state and utility credits/rebates	Would require heat pump-certified installation and maintenance expertise and experience		
As a single unit, heats and cools rooms more effectively and consistently	Would potentially use more electricity to run than an AC unit unless set-up and adjusted properly		

Pondering these, our ecological concerns outweighed the potential financial risk and we switched our household energy focus to heat pump technology. Now, 24 months later, we still believe we made the right decision, but have learned a few things:

- Most HVAC contractors in the Grand Valley appear to be unfamiliar with heat pump technology. Our contractor spent the better part of 6 months and multiple crew visits completing the installation of both the heat pump and air handler. Our impression was that we were an unwitting training vehicle for their technicians. Recommendation: Do your research; look for certified heat pump technicians.
- **Equipment reliability is important.** Of the 24 heat pump manufacturers on the market, only 2 achieved the highest ratings from Consumer Reports for predicted reliability and owner satisfaction: American Standard and Trane. Ours is the former.
- **Heat pumps will freeze up**, as ours did last February when the temperature in GJ dropped to 1 degree F. But the unit comes with a defrost capability that is automatically triggered. After several hours, the unit resumed operation.

Finance News

Pledge Statements

After stuffing about half the 70some letters and statements into envelopes, it occurred to me that the letter could have been better.

Too late then!

Here is what I wish I had included:

Pledges and pledge payments are voluntary. The pledge statement says "amount due" but what we actually mean is "if you are willing and able to pay the full amount of your pledge, this is the amount remaining to be paid." You also have a choice of when you make your payments.

The church year runs from July I to June 30. Most people pay during the church year, but some pay their pledges before the church year starts, and others finish up their payments during the summer after the church year has ended.

If you filled out a card for the \$20 Campaign, the amount you agreed to pay has been added to your pledge and is included in the pledge statement.



NPI Grant Application





The Colorado Department of Local Affairs and Community Shares of Colorado is offering the Nonprofit Infrastructure (NPI) Grant Program. It is a statewide grant program for small, community-based, nonprofit organizations. Funds can be used for organizational capacity needs, such as professional development for the board and staff alike, strategic planning, technology, etc. Funding runs through December 2026.

We have applied for a grant, asking for \$70,800 over the next three years, which is the maximum allowed. We will find out in December how much (if any) we will receive.

We requested funds for staff salaries, OWL instructor training, computers, and improvements. We also included 10% for administration costs such as insurance and reporting requirements. The bulk of our request was for a third of the cost of our new Director of Programming and Community Outreach (Maya's new job). Even though it is called infrastructure grant, it does not cover buildings or parking lots.

\$20 Campaign

A total of \$5,420 was pledged to the \$20 campaign from 24 individuals or families! This does not include additional money being placed in the offering basket by people who didn't fill out a card. This was a great response and is a testament to the collective power of many small contributions!

Our Building Loan

The UUCGV does not have a typical mortgage, but a repayment agreement to Betty Foreman. She and Dale purchased the building for us. We owe Betty \$2,267 monthly with the entire remaining balance (if any) due June 1, 2034. Our current balance due is \$239,000 which includes the principal and 4% interest. If we were to receive donations for a building fund they would most likely be saved to cover future monthly payments.
