FROM OUR MINISTER, REVEREND WENDY JONES

As Unitarian Universalists, we live out our faith based on seven basic principles. Our 1st principle acknowledges the inherent worth and dignity of every person. Because of this commitment to actively acknowledge this inherent worth, we are in a unique position to step up as leaders to actively apply and live out this principle.

Here in the United States and around the world, we are seeing an increase in antisemitism as the conflict in Gaza continues.

Let me be clear and state unequivocally, Jewish lives matter! It is our role to stand up, speak out and stand strong with our Jewish neighbors, family and friends. When we see antisemitic acts happening we must be the first people to stand strong and proclaim loudly, "this will not be tolerated!"

Likewise, as our 7th principle acknowledges the interdependent web of all existence, we understand that as a human community we are all one.

In this we stand with the civilians in Palestine, who are just trying to survive from day to day. Palestinian lives matter!

EQUAL EXCHANGE COFFEE FOR SALE AT UUCGV

Our Equal Exchange product sales has a primary function to be actively supporting some of our UU principles.


The coffees and teas in our display shelf in the kitchen are produced by small farms --mostly in Central and South America and Africa. The growers are guaranteed upfront fair prices and are financially rewarded for doing shade-growing, organically and humanely.

The packaging and distribution are additional cooperative activities that distinguish Equal Exchange from typical corporate food production and marketing. The Better World Shopping Guide named Equal Exchange as one of only two coffee companies given the Guide's star rating. Four times EE was awarded "most democratic workplace" and was certified as a major leader in the fair trade movement.

UUCGV puts the small profit we make from these coffee and tea sales to pay for our social hour beverages. We have maintained low prices in our display for our congregants to keep a good volume of sales going and thus reorders---that help those small farmers and their families. Our usual social hour coffees (regular and decaf) are Equal Exchange's Fellowship blend. If you have enjoyed those, you will be able to purchase them from the display sales shelf again this month. We just introduced a Rooibos Chai herbal tea to the display, as well. Rooibos has been receiving much attention for it's highly beneficial health value.

Coffee starts at \$9/bag and Teas are \$4/box. There is a collection box in the display to put your money. Enjoy!

Join us on Friday, November 17th for a screening of documentary filmmaker Mike Youngren's newest film entitled WCGW? (What Could Go Wrong?).

This documentary details past and present plans to build an expensive rail line to support a massive increase in crude oil produced in the Uintah Basin. If the railroad plans are ever realized, the waxy crude would be sent toward southern state refineries by way of Colorado.

ABOUT MIKE YOUNGREN

Mike Youngren spent 45 years in television news and production. He started as a reporter ('66), eventually became a documentary producer, a news program producer and in '79 a news director (in charge of the product) in Oklahoma City, then Salt Lake City and Denver.

Mike has been directly involved (producer/writer/sometimes cinematographer/editor) in roughly 40 television documentaries. Many of those programs won local awards. Some won regional awards (Emmys, SPJ). One (Clouds of Doubt) <https://youtu.be/kaDf8gVETXQ> won a Edward R. Murrow (Radio/TV News Directors) and a Columbia/Dupont Silver Baton and other national trophies. The first major documentary ('69) was built around a prison interview with two Utah killers - the timing matched a SCOTUS decision to halt capital punishment - the program was broadcast on the NBC network.

As a reporter, Mike covered everything from the 1968 Democratic National Convention to ten years of Ted Bundy and beyond. Some of his first work involved four documentaries that anticipated the creation of Canyonlands National Park and elevating Arches and Capitol Reef to NP status.

Since Mike retired in 2008, he has produced documentary programs by himself - sometimes with the assistance of friends with whom he used to work (audio, camera, lighting, music, narration, etc).

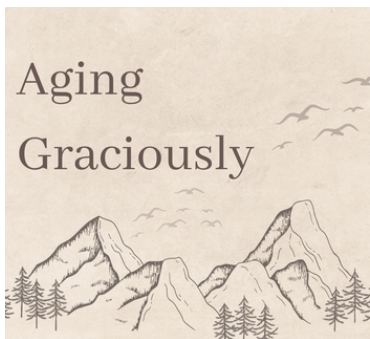

Colorado Recycles Week

You are invited to join Recycle Colorado, Mesa County, and the City of Grand Junction for an afternoon lunch & learn and tour of the current recycling and waste infrastructure in Mesa County. In addition to touring Mesa County's landfill, you will get a first-hand look at a composting operation that handles over 60,000 cubic yards of yard waste annually and a Hazardous Waste Collection Facility, one of only eight in the state! Afterward, we'll head to the City of Grand Junction's Materials Recovery Facility. The processing facility tour will provide a better perspective of much-needed infrastructure, which will help support the EPR legislation. The current processing facility is considered more of a "mini-MRF" with limited ability to process materials. Participants will be able to view the public drop-off, which, on average, has 300 visitors daily. This drop-off is open to all residents, Monday through Saturday, with frequent visitors coming from as far as Moab, UT.

TLC meets the **second Thursday** of the month at 3:30pm. Typically directly before the Board Meeting

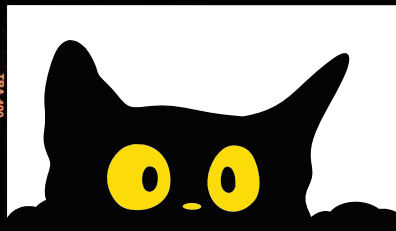
